The mission statement of the Principle Centered Leadership Program is “to establish a program to support and nurture business leaders in



Ignatian Volunteer Corps Opens in New England

With its opening in September 2008, the Ignatian Volunteer Corps (IVC) New England will begin to address the social needs in the cities of Boston, Providence, and Worcester with a core of experienced and skilled mature adults, supported by a unique spiritual reflection program.

IVC's mission is to serve materially poor people through partnerships with community organizations by providing the capable help of Ignatian volunteers—men and women, aged 50 and greater—who have committed to offering their talents, wisdom, and lifetime of experiences to serve those in need, work for a more just society, and grow deeper in their own Christian faith.

IVC is a national nonprofit organization, founded by two Jesuit priests, Frs. Jim Conroy, SJ, and Charlie Costello, SJ, in 1995, responding to the desires of older adults to give back for all they have been given.
