# Province Office Welcomes Sisters Kay and Ellen

Sister of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Kay Hannigan, and Sister of Notre Dame, Ellen Keane moved into the offices at 85 School Street this fall, bringing with them warmth, spirituality and joy. The sisters moved from the Cambridge office of Center for Religious Development (CRD) which came to a close in May 2009. Sisters Kay and Ellen continue to offer spiritual direction, training and a practicum for those giving spiritual direction as part of The Jesuit Collaborative's New England outreach.

## Sr. Kay Hannigan reflects on the history of CRD.

The New England Province established the Center for Religious Development 38 years ago. Its basic aim was to assist people who wanted to let God develop a unique relationship with them and thought they would benefit from talking about it. In 1972, a nine-month associate program began. Its purpose was to help participants become more capable spiritual directors. The program included the actual practice of spiritual direction, supervision of this learning experience, and theological, psychological and historical reflection on the experience of spiritual direction. Spiritual direction is the assistance by one person to another, which enables that person to pay attention to God's communication to him or her, to respond to God, to grow in intimacy with God and to live out the consequences of the relationship. As Fr. Bill Barry, SJ, one of CRD's founding directors says, "We help people talk about their experience of God."

Since 1972, 265 men and women from five different continents have graduated from the center and spread the ministry of spiritual direction and supervision to many parts of the world.

In the fall of 1998, the Center for Religious Development and Weston Jesuit School of Theology began a new venture, an MA degree in spiritual direction. This continued with the Boston College School of Theology and Ministry (BCSTM) during this past year. This two-year program included a year of academics taken at BCSTM and a year of practicum taken at CRD in the associate program. In the fall of 1999, the center began a beginner's practicum in the ministry of spiritual direction in collaboration with Weston Jesuit School of Theology. This now continues with BCSTM and is open to all students in the Boston Theological Institute.

The heart and soul of both programs has been found in the supervision component. Both individual and group supervision have been a fruitful source of learning and assistance to both new and experienced directors. Graduates of both programs continue to return to the center each month for group supervision. This ongoing supervision assists all in the awareness of the many ways God acts in the lives of all of us.

In recent years, over 50 people came weekly seeking spiritual direction. We have deep gratitude and appreciation for the New England Province of the Society



of Jesus whose vision and prayerful discernment made the CRD possible. And we pray that God will continue to bless the work of The Jesuit Collaborative as it serves the Church by providing for the spiritual development and care of persons, forming leaders and nurturing a faith that does justice.

Sr. Kay Hannigan, PBVM, is a 1987 graduate of CRD and past major superior of the Sisters of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. She has been involved in the ministry of spiritual direction and retreats for many years.
